### WHERE ARE THE CAMPS AND RETREATS HELD?

### WHEN ARE THE RETREATS?

The OMP of the RMC offers various programming ministries for middle and high school aged youth during the fall, winter, and spring seasons.

Each year, we offer:

- A Fall Retreat called SpiritSpark usually toward the end of October.
- A Confirmation Retreat in February.
- A Spring Retreat in March / April.

In addition, we support a youth leadership model in which Senior High youth apply to serve on the Leadership Committee. This team of youth and trained adult leaders serve as the planning team for our Fall and Spring retreats.

- \* Electronic devices such as iPods may be used only during personal time

### I HAVE FOOD ALERGIES. CAN LA FORET ACCOMMODATE THEM?

Yes! The kitchen staff at La Foret is trained and familiar with the many allergies campers have and are alerted prior to the beginning of each camp the nature and severity of camper allergies. Be sure to note allergies during your registration process so we can pass the information onto La Foret.

### IS THERE A CAMP NURSE?

Yes! We hire a registered nurse for all our week long youth camps and most of our retreats. S/he collects medications and dispenses them for campers at mealtimes and bedtimes. S/he also assesses any unforeseen accidents and partners with La Foret staff, Conference staff, and camp / retreat directors in enacting safety protocols.

## YIKES! CAMP IS OUT OF OUR BUDGET! WHAT ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS?

There are three ways to help cover camp costs.

- 1. The first is during the online registration process. You will have the opportunity to select the "My family needs a campership" button which will reduce your fee. The amount varies by camp and will be automatically deducted from your Registration Account.
- 2. The second is through your local UCC church. The RMC expects that local churches will help campers who need assistance by providing matching scholarships. Please speak to your pastor or youth leader for more information on the resources your local church has set aside as a mission offering to the wider church for this purpose.
- 3. The third is through Church / Association / RMC Partnerships.
