March 16, 2023 Pastoral Reflection: Spaciousness

I want to start by acknowledging the weight and density of this time. There is so much that I want to say and there is so much that needs tending. For the last few months my primary goal has been to simply be responsive to the ongoing needs and responsibilities of the conference. When all of this began back in November I thought back to my first months at Holladay UCC in 2003 and how the conference was also in turmoil then, and the ripple effect that had on the local church. So to the best of my ability I have tried to be present to the needs of our churches, especially those in transition, to the needs of clergy, to the Conference Wide Committee on Ministry as it carries forward its ministry among us and to begin shaping this year's Annual Celebration. I am grateful to the many words of encouragement and gratitude that so many of you have shared with me in this difficult time.

With the arrival of Rev. Diane Wieble, I now find myself eager to tend to the many layers that need tending in our conference. There are conversations that need facilitating. Relationships that need mending. Reparations that need making. Learning that needs integrating. Every week it seems the list grows. There is a whirlwind of thoughts in my mind and they all feel urgent. But when I pause, and I listen instead to my body, I remember the gift of my sabbatical this summer, and the importance of slowing down, of breathing, of creating space. I am reminded of Teilhard's de Chardin's words, "Trust in the slow work of God." I am reminded of many who have said, "Times are urgent, go slow."

Early in December I came across this poem by Rosemary Wahtola Trommer and have been carrying it with me as a daily reminder to remember to breathe and to slow down.

Lumbcricus Terrestris On a day when the world is weighty, dark and dense with need. I want to be the earthworm that gives itself over to tunneling, its every movement an act of bringing spaciousness. And when minutes feel crushed by urgency, I want to meet the world wormlike. which is to say grounded, consistent, even slow. No matter how desperate the situation, the worm does not tunnel faster nor burrow more. It knows it can take decades to build fine soil. To whatever is compacted, the worm offers its good worm work, quietly bringing porosity to what is trodden, compressed. So often, in my rush to repair, I end up exhausted. Let my gift to the world be my constancy, a devotion to openness,

my willingness to be with what is. Let my gift to myself be patience as I tend what is dense and dark

There is much work ahead. It is my prayer that as we work through these many layers we can invoke the patience of earthworms and invite the spaciousness of God to accompany us as we tunnel through the weight and density together.
