
#### Pastoral Reflection: We Cannot Do This Alone

After the 146th mass shooting in our country this year, Rev. Dr. Chad Abbott, Conference Minister of the Indiana-Kentucky Conference, along with his counterpart in the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America issued a joint statement, <u>Lament for Louisville</u>.

In it they write, "We call upon congregations and leaders and members of our churches to hold safe space for those dealing with the fears and threats related to violence in all its manifestations...Please join us in praying and advocating for the just and peaceful world that is God's desire and promise for us."

In the hours after the shooting, Rev. Dr. Abbott wrote about the local churches near where the shooting occurred that opened their doors for people who needed a safe space to gather. Ministers in the Conference and in other churches showed up to offer pastoral care.

The churches of the Rocky Mountain Conference know this all too well. Next week marks the 24th anniversary of the Columbine High School shooting. Last month was the 2-year anniversary of the King Soopers supermarket shooting in Bouder, which, like the shooting at the bank in Louisville this week, occurred just a mile from one of our churches. And, we continue to grieve the loss of life at the Club Q shooting in Colorado Springs just last November.

As I'm learning more about the Rocky Mountain Conference, I learned something today that I did not know. Columbine High School marks the anniversary of the shooting each year with a day of service. The school is closed and students sign up for service projects. Many of those projects are at surrounding schools.

Just like in Louisville, all of these horrific events have something in common—the Church joins hands with the community and shows up. We set aside our concerns about budgets and membership and we let go of our theological differences in order to support one another in offering



care and compassion to those who are hurting. This is what we do in times of tragedy. It is in our DNA.

Holding safe space for people dealing with fears and threats in all its forms is a gift that our faith communities are given in the most tender and difficult times in an individual's life; in the life of a family; and/or in our communities.

The "Lament for Louisville" statement ends with a prayer from All Creation Sings (sundaysandseasons.com), which includes these words: With your might, empower us to change this broken world. Make us advocates for a stable society, alive with hope in you.

May we find ways to work together to offer care and compassion in the face of the tragedies we experience in our broken world. May we find opportunities to lean in when it feels uncomfortable and stay with the hard work when we are exhausted. May we find the brave spaces where we can offer respite and care for those who are hurting.
