



This past Sunday I had the joy of spending the day with Wheatland United Church of Christ in Wyoming. When their last pastor left in November of 2021 we had not yet found anyone who could be a parttime interim or do regular pulpit supply and so a small group of lay folks began working together to figure out how they were going to provide worship, bible study and pastoral care. For the last 18 months they have taken turns leading worship, doing their own bible study, and occasionally having an ordained clergy in the rotation. Though not always easy, turns out they are enjoying it, having fun even. I have shared with them regularly that they are on the front lines of reimagining what it means to be the church.

We are delighted to share that Derek Ritenour, a pastor and school administrator from Virginia, will be serving as a parliamentarian through the meeting.

We aren't promising that our coming together will be easy or comfortable or perfectly planned, but we do believe it is possible to come together as the Body of Christ and begin to wrestle with the issues that are critical to our ability to continue to support, nurture and inspire faith and justice communities across the west.

### Coming for summer 2024 - Lapp Lodge!



Here at La Foret we are getting more and more excited that **Lapp Lodge** is getting closer to becoming a reality. Planned and to be built in honor of Rev. Robinson "Robb" Lapp and his wife Janet, who together led a life of great ministry along with a lifelong commitment and support of La Foret. Robb served first as a counselor at La Foret in the early 1960's and later even at times as a fill in Executive Director. During his career Robb served on our Board of Directors and countless committees over the years to ensure La Foret's success.

Lapp Lodge will have 15 guestrooms, a common lobby and adjoining meeting room. A fireplace in the lobby that will have an inside and outside hearth. Each guest room will have its own private bathroom. Each room will be outfitted with a queen bed, with overhead twin bed, a single twin bed and a set of murphy bunk beds. With a head on every pillow, each room could sleep up to six people, but also be very comfortable for fewer or a single person.

The lodge will be located on the edge of the meadow, across from Inglis hall. Parking and access will be on the backside to not infringe on the meadow. The entrance drive will be down the hill, midway between Prickly Pear cabin and the chapel. There will be a handicapped accessible walkway leading to the dining room. The lodge itself will be all one level, to ensure those with mobility challenges are not hindered by stairs or other obstacles.

Thanks to a generous bequest from the Susan B Duncan estate, plus the offer of a loan from the Cornerstone fund and an ongoing capital campaign, we have acquired the funds. The loan section will leave us with some debt, but the more success the capital campaign has, the less the debt will be. We are hopeful that many supporters of La Foret, both long time donors, newer and first-time donors will step up and contribute towards the lodge. We appreciate those who may wish to leave a bequest from a trust or from their will. The lodge will be a tremendous tribute to the Lapps and position La Foret for a future in new program offerings and future groups that can be attracted with a modern facility.

All gifts can be made at our website, <u>www.laforet.org</u>. We encourage monthly re-occurring gifts if you are able. A smaller amount given monthly can amount to a much more generous gift than what we may be able to do at one time. We deeply appreciate your consideration of support for Lapp Lodge. Together we can make this a reality for La Foret and all to enjoy.

They are envisioning a retired pastor, or a colleague who is in a part-time call at another church, who might be looking to supplement their current ministry over the next 6 to 9 months.
