One of the things that I love about her work is that she has taken her vision and laid out a road map for how we can practice Revolutionary Love in our lives and in our communities. It is a manual on how to take Jesus' mandate to love our neighbor as our self and put it into practice.

Which is why I hope you and/or a group from your church will consider participating in an upcoming event that is bringing Valarie Kaur to La Foret. Valarie will offer a keynote on 9/29 and a workshop on 9/30 to draw forth our deepest wisdom to explore how Revolutionary Love can transform our lives — love for others, our opponents, and ourselves. Through her renowned storytelling, teaching, and embodied inquiry, she will show us how to build beloved community, from the inside out. This is a unique and rare opportunity to come together with others of different faith traditions and be part of this movement for Revolutionary Love.

Discerning next steps for the Conference Wide Committee on Ministry

It is hard to believe it has almost been two years since we formed a two-year Provisional Conference Wide Committee on Ministry (CWCOM). Its formation came out of a multi-year discernment process across Associations asking the question, "what is needed now and how best do we meet that need?" Through that process we discerned that in this time of rapid change and increased complexity, there was value in drawing together our collective wisdom and shared resources to be able to meet this complexity and change with as much excellence and grace and ingenuity as possible. Now that this initial two year provisional period is coming to an end, it is time to discern next steps. Are we ready to move this from being a provisional committee to a settled one, do we need an additional provisional period, do we want to move Committee on Ministry responsibilities back to the Associations?

Over the last two years those elected by the conference to serve on the CWCOM have been working very hard not only to carry out the responsibilities of the Committee on Ministry but to also evaluate along the way what has worked well, what hasn't worked well and what needs adjusting. As we said in November of 2021, this was a starting point. The leaders of each of the subcommittees are gathering next week to reflect on what we have learned and to make recommendations for the CWCOM moving forward.

These recommendations will be part of the agenda for the special Conference Meeting on Tuesday, November 28 at 6:30 pm. The recommendations will be available a month before the meeting for you to review. In order to ensure continuity should the conference choose to vote to continue with the CWCOM, the Nominating Committee is working on finding nominees for each of the subcommittees and if the vote is to continue with a CWCOM, they will be presenting nominees for the CWCOM. Synod 34

Indianapolis and the Indiana-Kentucky Conference hosted the 34th General Synod from June 30-July 4. It was the UCC's first in-person national gathering since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Rocky Mountain Conference Delegation started our days at 6:30am each morning at our Western Region Caucus Meeting. Our days were filled with workshops, committee meetings, plenary sessions, and vibrant worship services. Denver's own Rev. Nadia Bolz-Weber was the keynote speaker on Saturday.

13 out of the 14 proposed resolutions were passed. The only resolution that did not pass was Plant Based Living. This was the Resolution Committee to which I was assigned. We met for 7 and a half hours in one day to rewrite the resolution to make it more palatable to the wider church. It is a difficult task to wordsmith a resolution in a 40 person committee filled with very different views on the topic. I am very proud of the work the committee accomplished in order to come to a consensus to present the resolution to the floor. An amendment was added to the resolution on the floor. The resolution was then voted down.

By an incredibly narrow margin a UCC bylaw change was approved to change the frequency of General Synods from every 2 years to every 3 years.

Rev. Dr. Karen Georgia Thompson was elected General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ. She is the first woman and the first black woman to lead the denomination.

As a life long member of the United Church of Christ, it was a special honor to represent our church, the Southeastern Association, and the Rocky Mountain Conference at General Synod. I enjoyed taking part in the mission project of putting together period packets for Church World Services. I became friends with pastors and lay leaders throughout the country and deepened my relationships within our

Rocky Mountain Conference delegation. It was great getting to know our new Rocky Mountain Conference Minister, Rev. Dr. Doug Wooten.

Our next General Synod will he hosted in Kansas City, MO in 2025.
