

In the meantime, we are closely attending to our financial nets. Thank you to our Treasurer Kari Collins, Assistant Treasurer Teresa Campbell, RMC Office Financial Associate Brianna Gillmore, and the entire **Finance Committee** for bravely assessing our current budget. They are going through every line item, confirming and categorizing expenses and simplifying our spreadsheets. The team is on track to present the '23-'24 FY budget, as directed at the Annual Celebration, to the Conference at our special meeting on November 28. Please pray for them along the way.

Through all of this, we are discovering who we are and beginning to consider who we can be as a Conference. The Board is meeting in person on September 21-23 to take care of business items and to start forming strategies for navigating the season ahead. This will likely result in conversations in each of our Associations related to healing, identity, vision, and possibility. We expect these conversations to shape personnel structures and renew initiatives to support congregations in faithfulness, community engagement, generosity, and vitality. Watch for those opportunities. If you have ideas, concerns, or dreams to share ahead of our Board retreat – please do reach out to your **Association or ministry team Board Representative**.

Yes, we are still untangling and mending, and I expect that work to be ongoing. But in coming weeks and months I'm confident we'll start to see ways forward. Here's to working with one another to weave together something beautiful.

This simple document includes basic information about the contents of a church's entire collection of records and often includes a clear description of materials in the collection and an indication of how extensive they are. A good inventory makes it easier to keep track of all of the materials within the collection and goes a long way towards expanding accessibility to interested users.
