## **Greeting Rocky Mountain Conference and Friends,**

I want to begin with gratitude for the many kind words and well wishes I have received since sharing the news that I am stepping down from my position as Associate Conference Minister. My hearts is full receiving the support and encouragement you have shared with me. I also want to say that many of you have rightfully recognized that my announcement left my future with the conference unclear. Given that I no longer had a new call, I shared with Doug and the Board that I would be open to continuing beyond the 90 days in my call agreement to help the conference transition out of having a full time ACM. In the last few weeks I have been in conversation with Doug, the RMC Board, and the Personnel Committee to figure out a timeline for this transition. I appreciate your patience and your prayers in this time of continuing discernment.



It is also important to acknowledge the very real heartache that so many of us are feeling as we continue to witness the horrific events taking place in Israel and Gaza. A dear friend of mine from seminary was visiting the day the news broke of the attack by Hamas on Israeli citizens and we just sat with one another in grief at a loss for words. On another call with a leadership cohort I am part of, my friend Robin, who lives in Australia and who is Jewish, shared with us her grief and her own worry for friends who live in the region. I was struck by her sharing how meaningful it has been for her to have people reach out and say, "I don't know the right words or what to say but I just want you to know I am here and I see that you are pain."

I was preaching this past Sunday at First Congregational Church of Greeley and in conversation with people before and after the service I was aware of just how tender this news is for so many of us. Given that it was the middle of their stewardship season, Ben and Tamara(The co-pastors at FCC Greeley)had asked me to preach on generosity and abundance. In allhonesty, I found myself struggling to reconcile a message on generosity with the reality taking place in Israel and Gaza and I don't know that I did great job of it. But what I realized afterwards was how grateful it is to show up to a community of faith where people cared about what was happening even as they didn't know how to make sense of it or what to do with it.

In these days I find myself turning to those who are far more wise than I to discern what to do in times like these.

## **From The RMC Finance Committee**

At our RMC Annual Celebration in June, the budget for our current fiscal year was unanimously remanded back to the Finance Committee and Board of Directors to be reworked. The new proposed budget will be voted on at a special meeting of the Conference on Tues., Nov. 28, 2023 at 6:30.

The Finance Committee has been hard at work on the revised budget. Among other things, we have reformatted the budget to separate out operating income/expenses from Board Designated and Donor Restricted activities. Additionally, we have separated out expenses incurred in 2022-2023 fiscal year, but not paid until the current year. We have verified and/or updated each of the line items on the budget, and factored in Board approved staffing adjustments. These changes have helped us to clearly identify the actual costs needed to run the Conference on an annual basis. The Finance Committee also made the decision to move the Tributary Fund grants out of the operating budget beginning this fiscal year, and has asked the Board to identify funding from other resources for the Tributary Fund grants.

The Board of Directors is in the process of approving the final details of the budget, and the proposed budget will be published 30 days before the Nov 28th meeting, as is required in the bylaws.

The Finance Committee will host two sessions on Monday, November 6th (12:00 pm and 6:30pm) to answer any questions you may have on the proposed budget (both via zoom - link to be provided). We anticipate that the sessions should last about an hour, but we will stay as long as necessary if there are questions. You should also feel free to reach out to the Treasurer, Assistant Treasurer, or any member of the Finance Committee if you have questions and/or are unable to attend the Nov. 6th Q&A sessions.

The Finance Committee is deeply grateful to Brianna Gillmore, our RMC Financial Associate, who is taking on increased responsibility as we seek to be accountable to the Conference as stewards of our Conference resources.
