Dear Rocky Mountain Conference,



Over the last few years my family and I have found ourselves increasingly determined to grow green things in the middle of winter. It all started when a friend of ours who used to work for a company that made projectable spheres gave us a whole bunch of molds that they were going to throw away. Turns out they can also be used as little greenhouses. My husband Joe scattered left over greens seeds on a garden bed and covered them with one of these domes. Sure enough the spinach started growing. They leaves remained small and didn't grow any

bigger through the winter. But they survived. And about mid-February when the sun started to move higher in the sky, the spinach took off. We loved going out to the little dome and seeing these bright green leaves in the midst of the stark landscape of winter.

Fast forward a few years and the latest experiment is now a greenhouse off the back of our garage. We have started spinach and arugula and Swiss chard. With a little aid, it thankfully survived the latest cold snap. I find such joy in going out into this greenhouse and running my hands across these tiny beautiful green leaves.

As I stood there in the greenhouse this week I wondered what wisdom is here for me, for us, in these little green shoots of life? I thought about the requirements necessary for life to survive in a harsh season: shelter, warmth, sun, and soil. I thought about how a just small amount of attention can impact its chances for survival. I thought about all the





unseen organisms beneath the surface that contribute to the life of these plants.



I also found myself thinking about all the various "shoots of life" that I have been able to witness in various settings across this conference over the last year. There are all kinds of stories of thoughtful, intentional acts bringing forth new life in surprising and unexpected ways. It is not hard to find visible signs of faithfulness and courage in your congregations and ministry settings. And I have to say, that too has been a source of joy in the midst of this particularly challenging season.

As I reflect on all of this I am aware that outside of the congregation I am often only one of handful who know these stories. I am also aware that for much of the past year the focus of conference has been inward on itself. And to be sure, there is still inward work to be done. But I am also cognizant of why I was drawn to conference ministry in the first place, which was to get to help create the kind of connections and foster the kind of learning that can help build the kind of communities in which life can thrive. As we seek to embody an

understanding of conference as a collective network of leaders and ministries, it only makes sense to me that we start sharing our stories with one another.

Which leads me to an idea: Beginning in Advent I'd like us to begin to share stories and reflections from our various settings in the Together newsletter. Each week, a different setting will be given the responsibility to share a bit of who they are, how God is showing up in their life together, and/or what has their attention in their communities in these days. I will be sharing in future newsletters the mechanism by which we will decide how to divvy up the weeks, but for now, I encourage you to consider what stories feel essential to share about your setting and about who and what God is calling you to be and to do. What is bringing you joy? What the signs of the Spirit at work in you and in your community?




