# 2024-2025 Annual Report of the Conference Wide Committee on Ministry Submitted by Rev. Leslie Etheridge (Bridge ACM) leslie@rmcucc.org

### A few highlights from our work this year have included:

- New Bridge ACM position activated approximately 6 months (Dec-May). I've been tasked with COM support. We've been busy. After beginning to build relationships with and between members of COM, we began looking together at our growing edges. To that end, we have:
  - Brought in 4 MIDs, and held 4 Ecclesiastical Councils and 2 Ordinations
  - We have welcomed 7 clergy into RMC and wished well 6 clergy as they transferred out.
  - Established monthly MID meetings for the purpose of fellowship, education, support and nurture.
  - Leveled out the committee workload with "COM 2.0," an enhanced structure that gives all members shared responsibility in our work.
  - Developed a "clergy check-in" practice to satisfy the MOM (Manual on Ministry) directive for periodic vocational support.
  - Developed consistent meeting times with all members meeting together to better learn and appreciate all facets of COM work.
  - Successfully conducted the Annual Information Review (AIR) reaching the vast majority of our authorized clergy at an incredible 94% return rate.
  - Conducted training for MID Advisors and MID Local Church Discernment Committees

### In 2025-2026, we're looking forward to:

- Fully implement COM 2.0 including
  - carrying out Clergy Check-Ins
  - creating position descriptions for each COM role
  - developing stronger relationships with Associations (with additional focus on retired clergy)
  - clarifying and simplifying Standing Expectations for clergy
  - o providing more opportunities for Boundary Training and Anti-Racism Training
  - creating and distributing MID Annual Review similar to AIR
  - o creating a realistic and inclusive MID Formation Plan
